Saving Time and Making Life Easier for Ontario Farmers

Governments launch enhanced online tool to renew Environmental Farm Plans

June 11, 2019 10:00 A.M.

The governments of Canada and Ontario are giving farmers in the province a quicker and easier way to renew their Environmental Farm Plans (EFPs).

Farmers in Ontario can now access an upgraded, electronic process to update their Environmental Farm Plans. The enhanced system will make it easier for many to continue using this key tool, which guides Ontario farmers to voluntarily adopt more environmentally sustainable practices. The changes will provide a more user-friendly and resourceful online tool, in addition to offering a convenient option for farmers to update their Environmental Farm Plans without requiring them to travel to attend in-person workshops.

The improved electronic [Environmental Farm Plan \(eEFP\)](#) instrument was developed by the Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association with support from the federal and provincial governments through the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (the Partnership).

"Through the Canadian Agricultural Partnership we are supporting initiatives that will save time for our hardworking farmers with easier access to existing resources and tools," said Marie-Claude Bibeau, federal Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food. "The environment is a top priority of our Government and we are pleased to invest in projects that facilitate the adoption of environmentally sustainable farming practices."

"Our government is pleased to help farmers stay current with their Environmental Farm Plans by allowing them to complete this important work on their own terms, without even having to leave the farm," said Ernie Hardeman, Ontario's Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs. "We're committed to finding ways to help our hardworking farmers avoid red tape, support their great environmental work and be better able to focus on growing their businesses."

"I applaud our governments and farmers for working together to implement a more digital-friendly tool that not only speeds up processes and keeps Ontario's farming industry competitive, but also encourages environmental protection," said Rod Phillips, Ontario's Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks. New Place to Grow program to boost industry
competitiveness and innovation

June 12, 2019 1:00 P.M.

TORONTO - Ontario's government is helping to grow the province's agri-food and agri-products sectors by launching the Place to Grow: Agri-food Innovation Initiative - a program which will help drive innovation, reduce red tape, and address industry priorities.

Under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership, this initiative will provide new cost-share funding opportunities to agriculture and food value-chain partners, while encouraging greater collaboration to identify opportunities and address challenges in the sector.

The new Place to Grow program will allow organizations to apply for projects in key priority areas, including:

- Labour supply and training challenges, which is a new category added for this program
- [Economic development](#) in the agri-food and agri-products sectors
- [Environmental stewardship](#) to enhance water quality and soil health
- [Protection and assurance](#) to reinforce the foundation for public trust in the sector through improved assurance systems in food safety and plant and animal health

In addition, there is a new category for bold, high-impact projects that are expected to create a sector-wide benefit.

"Ontario's agri-food sector is a huge employer in this province and a source of a wide array of food products enjoyed all over the globe. This enhanced programming will open doors for our agri-food businesses and give them more opportunities to help them grow, innovate and find greater success," said Ernie Hardeman, Ontario's Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs.

The first application intake for the *Place to Grow: Agri-food Innovation Initiative* will open on Aug. 15, 2019 and remain open through Sept. 27, 2019. The second intake will open on Jan. 6, 2020. The program will include planned, predictable future intakes each year of the Canadian Agricultural Partnership. The creation of the *Place to Grow: Agri-food Innovation Initiative* is based on a thorough review of program delivery to ensure maximum value for each dollar invested for farmers and the agri-food sector. As part of this review, it was determined that delivering the program within OMAFRA would shorten the time for approvals and save \$600,000 in administration costs which will be reinvested into the program.

To date, both the federal and provincial governments have committed cost-share support to more than 1,150 projects through the Partnership to help eligible farmers, processors, businesses and sector organizations innovate and grow.



New Place to Grow program to boost industry competitiveness and innovation (cont'd)

- The Canadian Agricultural Partnership (the Partnership) is a five-year, \$3 billion commitment by Canada's federal, provincial and territorial governments that supports Canada's agri-food and agri-products sectors.
- Administration of the cost-share funding under the Partnership to sector-level organizations is transitioning from the Agricultural Adaptation Council to the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA). Efficiencies created through OMAFRA's delivery of the programming will result in an additional \$600,000 in funding to benefit the entire Ontario agri-food sector through the Place to Grow: Agri-food Innovation Initiative.
- OMAFRA also delivers cost-share programming under the Partnership to food processors and other businesses (animal health, commercialization and primary agri-food business projects).
- Full program details on the Place to Grow: Agri-food Innovation Initiative will be available in August 2019.
- The first application intake for the Place to Grow: Agri-food Innovation Initiative will open on Aug. 15, 2019 and remain open through Sept. 27, 2019. The second Place to Grow intake is to take open on Jan. 6, 2020 and remain open through Jan. 27, 2020.
- The program will include planned, predictable future intakes each year during the life of the Partnership. Intakes will also take place at these times: Sept. 8-29, 2020; Jan. 4-25, 2021; and Sept. 7-27, 2021. The Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association continues to administer cost-share funding under the Partnership to farmers and other businesses (plant health projects).

Ontario Agricultural Topsoil Sampling

OSCIA is supporting a topsoil sampling campaign conducted by OMAFRA this summer to measure soil properties across the province. Sampling will start the week of June 10 in Southwestern Ontario and move across the province until September. This program will update our knowledge on the variability of soil properties in agricultural fields, which is vital for updating provincial soil maps, and compliments OSCIA's priority to support soil health initiatives and research for our members. If your farm falls within the range of the sampling sites identified by the ministry's computer program, you may be visited by an OMAFRA field staff member seeking land access in order to sample that site. Ontario Agricultural Topsoil Sampling Program

Soil staff of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) are carrying out a reconnaissance topsoil sampling project covering the province's agricultural soils. Comprehensive and current data on soil properties for the various agricultural soil types found across Ontario is lacking or out of date. Through this initiative, our goal is to better understand the variability and range of regional agricultural topsoil properties (such as pH, texture (sand, silt, clay %) and organic matter) by collecting up-to-date soil information throughout the province. This information will help OMAFRA modernize existing, historic provincial soil maps, inform best management practices, and develop soil health and stewardship related initiatives.

This project has the support of the University of Guelph (U of G), the Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association (OSCIA), and Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC). Researchers and students from the University may also support OMAFRA staff in the collection of soil samples.

Land Access, Personal and Business Information:

Access to private land is needed to complete this initiative. Therefore, OMAFRA respectfully seeks your permission to enter your property(s) to examine soil features in greater detail and obtain soil samples. This land entry will only occur after permission has been granted by you, the land owner (or official designate). Please become a partner in this collaborative effort by granting access to your land parcel(s).

No personal information (e.g. landowner names, addresses) is being collected and retained by OMAFRA staff. Any business information asked by staff (e.g. questions on cropping rotations, tillage methods) is being collected in accordance with the requirements of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act for the purposes of the project. The information obtained from the soil sampling, including analytical data, may be made available to the collaborating organizations, namely U of G, OSCIA, and AAFC, for specific soil related research they may be undertaking.

How we conduct our work:

Field staff members from OMAFRA and/or the U of G will be conducting the on-site field sampling. Great care will be taken to avoid any damage to fields and crops. Field entry will primarily be on foot, respecting crop and livestock management practices, biosecurity measures (e.g. cleaning footwear before leaving a property), and any other measures requested by a landowner.

Small holes (approximately 15-30 cm deep) will be dug using hand tools (augers or shovels) to observe the depth of the topsoil and take a sample. The hole is then backfilled with the excavated material.

Site Selection:

Field sampling sites are being selected using a computer software program that uses landscape characteristics such as elevation, slope, general soil types and satellite data. This method allows us to identify the broadest range and variety of agricultural landscapes across Ontario in which to sample. The number of soil sample sites per field will vary depending on the landscape but will generally consist of 3 pits per field to capture the variability in field characteristics.

The Eastern Ontario Crop Diagnostic Day will provide a “hands-on” learning experience to assist in the correct identification and treatment of crop problems common to Eastern Ontario.
