

## Eastern Ontario Crop Conference 2007 – February 22<sup>nd</sup>



The Eastern Ontario Crop Conference is a co-operative effort between the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs and the Eastern Ontario Crop Advisory Committee. This annual one day conference is held the third week of February at Kemptville Campus, University of Guelph.

The program is designed to provide growers and agri-business personnel with the latest in-depth crop management information.
